- Planted 1974
- Located on the northeastern entrance to the loop, this block contains the oldest vines on the estate. Field 26 helped launch modern winemaking on Old Mission Peninsula.
- This section of trail crosses land being restored for replanting in May 2026 using mustard, clover, and field grass to rebuild soil health.



2 FIELD 21: THE NEXT GENERATION

- This vineyard represents the youngest vines on the property. Planted in 2019, these 4.5 acres of Sauvignon Blanc showcase modern viticulture focused on precision farming, balanced yields, and long-term sustainability.
- This block reflects how tradition and innovation continue to coexist on the estate.

MICRO-LOT CORRIDOR

3

- East: Lot 10 Muscat Ottonel (0.37 Ac)
- West: Lot 9 Chardonnay (0.35 Ac)
- These small blocks are harvested separately, allowing our winemaker to study how subtle changes in slope, soil, and sunlight shape flavor.
- As the trail narrows, vines flank the path - watch for posts and cables as you pass through.
- Note our mechanical harvester at the row's end!



4 THE SUSTAINABILITY HUB (ENGAGE 4X4 FOR THIS HILL)

- Located at the northeastern edge of the estate, at the base of the east-to-west vineyard slope, this area naturally collects rainwater and nutrients flowing through the property.
- Organic harvest material is returned to the soil as compost, while the holding pond serves as a natural filtration and conservation feature.
- Together, these systems support soil health, biodiversity, and long-term vineyard sustainability.

5 THE HOUSE OF RIESLING RIDGE (SCENIC NORTHERN OVERLOOK)

- South: Lot 18 (2.38 Ac)
- North: Lot 20 (3.15 Ac)
- Flanking the northern ridge of the loop, these Riesling blocks form the backbone of the winery's signature varietal, producing nearly 75 percent of Michigan's Riesling. Lot 20 includes the estate's scenic overlook.



6 THE CRUSH PAD: WHERE IT ALL COMES TOGETHER

- Located in the southwest corner of the winery facility, this is where each harvest arrives.
- Between 550 and 750 tons of grapes are processed here each year, with harvest running from the beginning of October through mid-November.
